COVID-19 declared a pandemic

The situation regarding COVID-19 (Coronavirus) has continued to develop.

The New Zealand government has put in place measures to reduce the proability of COVID-19 entering the country, including stricter requirements for people arriving from most overseas countries.

The Ministry of Health advises that with continued vigilance the chance of widespread community outbreak remains low.

The health of our students and staff is a high priority.

Schools are under instruction from the Ministry of Education and Ministry of Health regarding appropriate actions.

At this stage, schools remain open and all students are expected to attend.

Like the flu, COVID-19 can be transmitted from person to person through droplets when an infected person coughs, sneezes or talks, they may transfer droplets containing the virus.

If a person comes into contact with these droplets, the virus can be transferred by touching the nose, mouth or eyes.

Everyone must take responsibility to protect themselves and others from spreading the illness through the following simple actions:

- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Stay home if you are unwell.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Put your used tissue in the rubbish bin or in a plastic bag.
- Wash your hands thoroughly and often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. Dry your hands completely.

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Small Groups @ TPHS

Every student at Te Puke High School is a member of a Small Group of approximately 16 students. You will remain in this Small Group for the whole time you are at Te Puke High School. Each Small Group has a Small Group Leader.

Each Small Group is made up of students from Year 9 to Year 13.

Each Small Group belongs to a specific house which is led by a staff member called Head of House.

Lockers for Students

Student Lockers have been extremely popular this year to hire from the school.

The lockers are situated next to The Student Learning Centre and outside the PODS.

They are monitored by video surveillance at all times.

- \$40 for small lockers, suitable for books and the like only.
- \$55 for medium lockers, suitable for books and bags.
- \$70 for large lockers, suitable for books, bags and sports gear all sold.

A \$30 key bond applies to all lockers that are hired.

The \$30 bond will be returned when the key is handed in at the end of the year.

Important Information

Attendance

All students of Te Puke High School are expected to attend school every day to achieve their personal best. Te Puke High School considers all forms of absence without legitimate explanation to be unjustified and is required by law to follow up on unjustified absences.

Parents/caregivers are expected to contact the school if their child is away from school. Parents/caregivers may ring the school office on (07) 573 97 69 or send in an email to register an absence. Students must always bring a note from their parents/caregivers the day they return to school. The Attendance Officer, Small Group Leaders and Heads of House will follow up attendance matters.

Sickness and Emergencies

Te Puke High School has a well maintained Health Centre with trained staff, including:

- Office staff who are trained in First Aid
- The Student Health Co-ordinator who is available most days of the week
- A doctor who attends for a two-hour session each week.

This is a confidential, free service for students. All students who are sick or injured while at school must report to the student office.

Harassment

Te Puke High School does not tolerate any form of harassment. Any concerns of harassment are taken seriously. If any student is harassed, they should seek help immediately from a designated senior student or a staff member. Parents/caregivers should contact their child's Small Group Leader, Subject Teacher or Head of House if they have any concerns.

Concerns and Complaints

Te Puke High School takes concerns and complaints about students and staff seriously. If a student or parent/caregiver has a concern or complaint, they should contact their child's Small Group Leader, Subject Teacher or Head of House.

Leaving School Grounds

All students of Te Puke High School are expected to remain at school all day, every day, unless they are on official school business. Te Puke High School discourages any other reasons for leaving school at any time throughout the day. If a parent/ caregiver requires their child's learning to be interrupted through leaving the school grounds for legitimate reasons, the student must present their written note to the reception staff prior to leaving the school grounds. When the student returns to school from their appointment they are required to sign in at the reception. For legal reasons, the written note from the parent/caregiver must be signed and dated. Students are not permitted to leave the school grounds at lunchtime.

Personal Electronic Devices

Students who bring electronic devices such as mobile phones, cameras, MP3 players, iPods etc to school, do so at their own risk. The school takes no responsibility for loss, damage or theft of these electronic devices. Staff will confiscate these items if they are visible during class time or used irresponsibly during the day.

Personal Property

The school will not accept responsibility for the loss of money or valuable articles that are brought to school. All personal property should be clearly and permanently marked with the student's name.

Transport to and from School

Te Puke High School encourages all students who are eligible for free transport to travel to and from school by bus.

Students wishing to drive a vehicle to school, or to transport other students, must abide by all road rules at all times.

Student ID Cards

Te Puke High School students are able to purchase a Student ID card for \$ 5.00.

This is used at school for:

- Issuing library books
- Issuing sports gear
- Issuing netbook laptops
- Printing and photocopying
- Entry to social events.

Te Puke High School Health Nurse

My name is Natasha Harris (Tarsh) and I have been the schools health nurse for the past 6 and a half years.



I am a registered Nurse and employed by the WBOPPHO and they put nurses into all secondary schools.

I have lived in Te Puke for the last 22 years and have loved every minute of it.

I am passionate about health and being able to support others on their health journey.

I am available to see students fulltime with another Nurse, Tricia, being also available every Tuesday and Friday.

Doctor Vanessa Muller is available to see students every Wednesday morning and we are very fortunate to have her.

This service is free to all students.

In addition to this service, an agreement between the Ministry of Health and the Western Bay of Plenty Primary Health Organisation allows all Year 9 students to have a health assessment.

These assessments include a discussion around development, hearing, vision, weight and height, blood pressure, home situation, education, eating, activities, drugs, smoking, sexuality, mood and safety. The goal of our nursing service for all students is to support students' wellbeing through early detection of any health issues, through referral and treatment and ongoing support. The aim of this assessment is positive youth development throughout the school years.

Te Puke High School Mobile Phone Regulations

- 1. Mobile phones **must be switched off and put away** in the student's bag or pocket, before entering the classroom or learning space.
- 2. Mobile phones **must not be used during class time** unless the teacher requires them to be used for a specific task.
- 3. Mobile phones and headphones that are **visible** during class time will be **confiscated** by the teacher until the end of the period.
- Mobile phones that have been confiscated two times will be given to the Senior Leadership Team (SLT). The owner of the phone will need to collect it from the SLT office at the end of the day.
- Mobile phones that have been confiscated more than two times will be given to the SLT. A parent/caregiver will need to come and collect it.
- 6. Students who do not follow these regulations will be dealt with by the SLT.
